

Evanston Scholars improves college access and success for a diverse group of ambitious Evanston students who are traditionally first-generation college entrants, students from low-income families, and students of color, starting with the college admissions process, continuing through college graduation, and into a career.



Dear Friends,

2020. In hindsight, it appears that the pandemic has peeled back many layers to reveal the true essence of societal inequalities, our true selves, and perhaps even organizations. For Evanston Scholars, peeling back our layers has shown us that our network is strong, that our foundation is solid, and that we are well positioned for the future.

Looking back on our year, we know the impact of COVID-19 dominates our perspective. However, we need to recognize our accomplishments and growth before March hit. We supported nearly 75 High School Scholars, especially our graduating seniors who ended up receiving an average of \$128K of debt-free money to the schools they will attend. We supported 130 College Scholars – 94% of whom are persisting towards a college degree.

When the pandemic came in March, our solid structure remained intact. The power of the people and the relationships in our network was amplified. Staff stepped up. Mentors leaned in. Board members rallied. And community members stepped into the moment to support us. We had to pivot, adjust our modes of communication, and rethink and revise our strategies based on the changing needs of our Scholars.

Fundamentally, however, what we do has remained the same. We leverage our relationships to guide Scholars to college, assist them in the transition to college, and support them to get through college. We counsel through obstacles. We help to create social capital. We remind them of their short and long-term goals – to stay focused on the process and the product.

We all know the future is uncertain. Our Scholars are in a critical phase of their life-long journeys, and they want to keep moving down their paths. Now is the time for us to guide them and support them more than ever. There will be higher hurdles ahead – financial constraints, racial tensions, and other issues we can not even predict now. Evanston Scholars is ready. We are strongly positioned to address whatever comes next, and we will continue to rely on the relationships within our network. Thank you so much for being a part of that network.

Evanston Scholars delivers a comprehensive, six-year program that guides students through the college admission process, supports them to persist in and graduate from college, and prepares them for strong careers.


We break our program down into three phases: College Access, College Success, and Career Readiness.

College Access

Throughout their junior and senior years of high school, our College Access program provides High School Scholars with monthly college prep workshops, tutoring, college visits, test preparation, and **individualized college selection** and financial aid counseling.

COVID-19 Update

Once ETHS closed and High School
Scholars began sheltering at home,
we shifted to a virtual College Access program.
Staff offered regular check-ins and college
advising over Zoom, helping our seniors make their
college choices and negotiate financial aid packages
in a constantly shifting landscape. They also helped
Scholars adjust to and optimize remote learning.
Evanston Scholars staff connected Scholars with
resources to acquire any needed technology or
tech support, and advised Scholars on how to
create quiet spaces, adapt their study habits,
and create at-home schedules to get the





College Success

For all four years of college, our College Success team provides College Scholars with regular check-ins, executive functioning and mental health support, academic and financial counseling, a yearly college textbook and supplies allowance, and access to funds in case of an emergency. College Scholars who thrive academically join our Circle of Honor. Those who struggle with their studies receive follow-up and support. Our team also helps connect College Scholars to their on-campus peers and to support and networking services provided by their institutions.

COVID-19 Update

College and university closings in mid-March were especially tough on College Scholars and their parents. Many families were unable to take time off from work or afford the cost of bringing their student home. As schools began to shut down, our College Success team connected with every College Scholar. They offered moral support, guidance, and travel assistance to make sure everyone returned home safely, even helping one Scholar make it home from New Zealand. Once our College Scholars settled in, College Success staff supported their transition to being at home and attending classes remotely, enabling them to persist through the semester despite their new challenges.



Es Career Readiness

Career Readiness begins in junior year of high school when High School Scholars explore their interests, assess their strengths, and start building their resumes. Once students matriculate in college, our staff helps them navigate the networks and career-related resources available at their schools. We show them how to maximize their profiles online and assist them in securing summer internships. On school breaks and during the summer, students prepare for their career launch by participating in career workshops, interview coaching, and networking opportunities with our community and corporate partners.

COVID-19 Update

Many College Scholars lost summer jobs and internships that would have provided much-needed experience, as well as income. To help replace these summer opportunities and wages, Evanston Scholars implemented

Scholar-Designed Internships (SDI). The Evanston
Community Foundation and the Lewis-Sebring Family
Foundation funded this seven-week paid experiential
learning and research project. Fifteen SDI participants
researched and reported on a topic that aligned with
their academic and career interests. At the end
of the program, each Scholar presented their
findings to Evanston Scholars staff,
mentors, and other supporters.
